Numbers 21:4-9

⁴From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. ⁵The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? 
Ephesians 2:1-10



About the Prelude:A note from Leon: On March 10th, the 3rd Annual Women Composers Sunday celebrated by the American Guild of Organists, I will play "Largo in A-flat Major" by Elizabeth Stirling. She was an English composer (1819-1895), educated at home but studied organ, piano and harmony, privately at the Royal Academy of Music. She began earning a living as a musician at age 16 after her father's business failed and became a respected composer, church organist and recitalist. She was known for her impressive pedal technique and is believed to be the first person in Britain to have performed J.S. Bach's "St. Anne" Prelude and Fugue at a public recital.
