Come, Holy Spirit

Dear Friends in Christ,

"When the day of Pentecost came, [all the believers] were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting" (**Acts 2:1**). This year, the day of Pentecost is May 20. It's a day to celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, and the Spirit's ongoing presence with us. The month of May also marks a change to the summer schedule. We will have one worship service at 10:00 a.m. beginning on May 27. I hope you will continue to make worship a priority even if your personal schedule or pace of life change in the summer, so you can stay connected to Jesus and the Reformation community. When the Holy Spirit came to the believers, tongues of fire hovered over them and they could speak in all different languages. The Spirit lit the fire of faith in them. Peter explained how everything was different now that God had raised Jesus from the dead, and now that the promised Holy Spirit had been poured out on them.

Recently, Pastor Eric and I attended a meeting for Delmarva clergy with our Bishop, Bill Gohl. Bishop Gohl gave us the hopeful message that he sees the churches in the Delaware-Maryland Synod being in a "Pentecost moment." The Spirit is at work across our Synod. That got me reflecting on Pentecost moments I've been privileged to witness at Reformation during this school year that is about to end.

Picture these moments in your mind:

As a closing prayer at **ReCreation**, children, youth and adults passed a ball of yarn from one person to another. As the yarn was tossed across the table, each person said a prayer aloud for the person they were throwing the yarn to. The crisscrossing yarn throughout the Fellowship Hall knit together the participants of all ages in prayer.

At our annual Easter Egg Hunt, 15 youth and adults prepared the event for the community. The efforts and leadership of our youth impressed me. It was wonderful to see Reformation

folks of all ages enjoying working on this service project together. One family from the community told me they came to our Egg Hunt last year and returned this year **"because everyone was so nice here and our kids felt so welcome."**

Seven young people received First Holy Communion on Palm Sunday, and most of them attended Acolyte Training a month later to see what is involved in serving in worship as an Acolyte.

One Saturday morning a month, Coffee & Crawlers makes the Narthex a lively place filled with toys, laughter, and parents talking and sharing about life with little ones. I share a Bible Story from the Spark Bible we give all baptized children so they can hear God's word in a way that speaks most clearly to them.

At the end of our April **ReCreation** event, four Healing Prayer Ministers prayed with people one-on-one. During the event, we shared stories of faith and healing, and life and hope. Offering Healing Prayer in the midst of all ages in the Fellowship Hall was a powerful experience for everyone who received prayer, and for those who witnessed the willingness of their friends in Christ to ask for prayer.

We are blessed to regularly have visitors in worship. It is a Pentecost moment when you take the time to go over to the new person, warmly welcome them, find out his or her name, and offer them hospitality. That could look like helping them follow along in the bulletin, inviting them to stay for **ReCreation**, or bending down and saying hello to children. When we offer our heart-felt welcome to a newcomer, we share the love of Jesus.

There are many more Pentecost moments at Reformation. The wind of the Holy Spirit is blowing through our church and empowering us to love and serve others. **Be on the lookout for Pentecost moments:** moments when you experience God's grace in a new way, or when you feel stirred to deeper faith, or when you are given the words to share the gospel with confidence and joy. I look forward to celebrating Pentecost with you on May 20. I look forward to seeing how the Holy Spirit will lead and guide us in faith and life, as we follow the risen Jesus together.

From the Church Financial Desk:

YTD Annual Attendance Numbers (through mid-April):

Average Weekly Worship Attendance:	136 (132 last year)
Average Weekly Faith Connections	35 (25 last year)
Maundy Thursday Attendance:	52 (54 last year)
Good Friday Attendance:	23 noon, 64 evening, 87 total (16 and 63, 79 total last year)
Easter Sunday Attendance:	254 (242 last year)

Our Sunday worship attendance has been strong this year, and while Maundy Thursday's attendance was roughly the same as last year's, both Good Friday and Easter Sunday saw significant "bumps" of 10% and 5%, respectively. Mid-week attendance in Lent was also increased with the Evening Prayer services.

Financial Report (as of 3/30/18):

Total Income:	\$120,424.69
Total Expense:	\$112,941.22
Income – Expense:	\$ 7,483.47
Benevolence Sent:	\$ 3,250.00

These are encouraging numbers! They show a strong financial position before Easter, when traditionally, we rely on Easter offerings to get us "back into the black." Kids, Inc. is managing income and expenses very well, and our offering numbers are well ahead of 2017's. "Benevolence sent" also shows the amount we have sent to the DE-MD Synod so far this year (we usually send it quarterly) as mission support. This funds the vital work of our synod and is very important to our life as part of something bigger than just our local church. Every gift marked as "benevolence" is passed on to the DE-MD Synod. Thank you for your generous support!

You can place your items in the tote marked Donations for Milford School District Homeless Children located in the Narthex.



To begin with, when you put **Benevolence Gifts** into the collection plate here at RLC, the funds are counted and sent quarterly to the DE-MD Synod, as mission support. Last year, **YOU**, as a congregation, sent through **your** generous gifts, \$14, 822.50 worth, to help support the synods programs. The Delaware -Maryland Generosity Team Vision is simply put ~ “**As interrelated communities of faith called to Christ centered living, we celebrate God’s grace by abundantly sharing our blessings and gifts locally and globally.**” So, where exactly, does your money go? Let me share a sampling with you:

- ✓ Lutheran Youth Organization, mentoring over 65 youth leaders, seeking to discover their God-given gifts and sharpen their skills for service in our synod, their own congregation and surrounding community.
- ✓ Over 700 youth and leaders in our Synod Youth Events spent time at camp Mar-Lu-Ridge, experiencing God in nature.
- ✓ Most exciting was the work vetting and getting approval of five new mission starts, including three ethnic specific ministries touching new communities from Asia and West Africa, plus the work being done in our conferences to bring congregations together in missional conversations to discern partnership ministry.
- ✓ We supported five thriving Campus Ministry sites across our synod, assuring faith connections for young adults in our church. Through service learning, student lead ministry, campus bible studies with meals and mission trips across the larger church, students at Towson, UMBC, Morgan State, UD and College Park continue to grow and find a life with Christ.
- ✓ Our Bishop and incredible staff, continuing to partner with our many congregations, some in transitions, and others seeking vitality, to equip and empower lay leaders, to seek out and share best practices in stewardship, leadership, evangelism, mission development, and so much more.
- ✓ **You** sustained strong guidance bringing together members throughout our synod to address issues of race, hunger, care for creation, incarceration, health, inclusion and community empowerment.

This is just a sampling of where **your** gifts go, to sustain the work of the Delaware-Maryland Synod, ELCA. Be proud of your engagement in these great works. Without **you**, these and other works would not continue to flourish.

Make a Joyful Noise unto the Lord

From the choir loft...

"Lutheranism, following the practices and teachings of Martin Luther, redefined worship and birthed a new style of church music that had never been seen up until this point: the entire congregation was finally able to sing their praises to God, not just a chorus or a cantor, but the whole church, from pastor to peasant, all were able to use their voices to glorify God in a language everyone could speak and understand. This was a pivotal moment in not only church and music history, but history as a whole. The echoes from this period can still be heard today resounding all over the world in the innumerable protestant churches preaching God's word, and in the voices of millions singing His praises in their own diverse and varied vernacular languages.

Although Luther wanted to break away from the Catholic Church, some persisted in this early era of the Lutheran church. In a famous quote from Luther, he preaches, "Music is God's greatest gift. It has often so stimulated and stirred me that I felt the desire to preach." This powerful feeling was instilled in him during his time in monasteries and friaries associated with the Catholic Church, so it is no surprise that Luther did not want to change every tradition associated with his former teachers and leaders. He would instead incorporate traditions from the old ways with new traditions to make a new and exciting amalgamation of the two that was easily accessible by long time Catholics and newly converted "Lutherans" alike. Luther realized if his members quibbled over little matters such as Mass order or types of hymns sung, people would become divided and their hearts and minds would be taken away from God and placed on worldly things that have little importance."

Come learn about “Prayer on the Go” on May 20 at ReCreation

Joyce Nauman shared a personal story about the power of spontaneous prayer and invited participants to share their healing stories with the large group.

The children and youth attending the April event made thank you cards for their health care providers, from pediatricians to school nurses and school counselors. The event ended with an opportunity for people to receive healing prayer from one of four healing prayer ministers.


