What Does Lent Say about Us?

Dear Friends in Christ,

It's March, but don't worry, you haven't missed Ash Wednesday or the beginning of Lent! Since Easter isn't until April 21, Ash Wednesday falls on March 6 this year. Reformation offers two worship opportunities to receive ashes, at 12:00 p.m. for a spoken service that lasts about 30 minutes, and a full service with music at 7:30 p.m. There is a Soup Supper at 6:30 p.m. before the evening Ash Wednesday service.

Every Wednesday during the following weeks of Lent, we will have a Soup Supper at 6:30 p.m. and an Evening Prayer worship service at 7:00 p.m. This 30-minute service will feature a few Bible readings, simple singing, and time for quiet contemplation. The midweek services are a wonderful way to slow down and reflect on God's Word in Scripture, and on our spiritual growth during the 40 days of Lent.

That's what we're doing for worship during Lent, but we have to address a more basic question: why do we observe Lent? Another way of putting this is: *What does Lent say about us?*

I thought of that question after a conversation I had last year with a group of friends, some who are actively involved in a Christian congregation and some who are not at all. It was during Lent. The church-goers were talking about the things we were doing and the extra worship services we were attending. One of the non-church going ladies asked, "What is Lent?" That was a great question, and I was glad for the opportunity to explain why I love the season of Lent.

I shared how Lent is the 40 days leading up to Easter (not counting Sundays), when we get to

Pastor's Message Continues

reflect on Jesus' life, ministry, suffering, and sacrifice on the cross for our sake. Jesus himself fasted in the wilderness and was tempted by Satan for 40 days before his earthly ministry began. We'll learn about Jesus' time in the wilderness in our reading from Luke 4:1-13 on the First Sunday in Lent. For us, Lent is a time to take an honest look at ourselves, our sin, and our struggles. It's a season to reflect on why we need Jesus to come and save us from sin and death. Lent offers us 40 days to focus on our faith and our relationship with Jesus, and to anticipate the joy of his resurrection to new life on Easter.

As the Apostle Paul wrote in one of our Lenten readings for worship, "*our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation that it may be conformed to the body of his glory...*" (Philippians 3:20-21). As I explained to my friends, Lent is about being extra-intentional about our faith practices, being honest about our sins and failings, and making decisions every day that help us be more like Jesus. He sacrificed everything, even life itself, to free us from sin and death. By regularly attending Sunday morning worship and Wednesday evening services, and enjoying fellowship with other believers at our Soup Suppers, Lent allows us to more fully prepare for the transformation, freedom, and new life God offers us when the 40 days are over on Easter Sunday.

What does Lent say about us? Participating in Lenten worship and practicing spiritual disciplines show that we trust that God continues to speak to us in new ways. When we observe Lent, we show the world that we believe that God loves us, and that He is with us. Our gracious God helps us become more like Christ in our relationships with others. I encourage you to make a commitment to observing Lent in a meaningful way, so you can get the most out of everything this important season has to offer.

Stewardship Statistics & Updates:

Thank you to everyone who has returned an Estimate of Giving card for 2019! We have been richly blessed by the congregation's response to our annual campaign. Total estimates are currently at \$213,000, up almost \$18,000 (9%) from last year! The average estimate is up about \$150, to \$2,500 per year, a roughly 6.5% increase. Remember, Estimate of Giving cards are primarily a tool to help you prayerfully discern how God is calling you to give. So, it isn't too late to complete one and return it to the church!

We also encourage you to continue fulfilling your pledges to "A Place for All," our 3-year capital campaign. Your gifts are helping to make Reformation more welcoming!

LEGISLATURE CONSIDERS INCREASED SPENDING FOR SCHOOLS

Education is a BIG item in the proposed \$4.3 billion Delaware state budget. About a third of all state monies go to fund the 152 public and 23 charter schools for children in grades K-12. Looked at from the opposite perspective, state funding covers about 2/3 of the costs of education in the state's 19 school districts. This is a much higher percentage than in many other states which tend to rely more on local property taxes to fund their schools.

Governor John Carney and many legislators have expressed concerns that too many children are failing in our state's schools. The problem especially shows itself among students from low-income families, students with disabilities, and those learning English. One study revealed that between 64 and 89% of these students do not meet the state's standards for reading and/or math.

The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) has filed a law suit against the state claiming that education funding is unfairly distributed. Since it tends to be distributed as a percentage of local funding, districts that have more funds available tend to receive more support and vice-versa. There is some evidence that per pupil funding declines in many schools serving low income students. Sometimes these are district-wide problems, because of low property values (and thus low tax revenues for the state to match) and sometimes the problems exist even within districts (when more experienced and higher paid teachers move away from schools with low income students). It's way too early to predict what the result of this law suit; it may produce a significant change in the way education is funded in the state, or it may come to naught.

Meanwhile the Governor's proposed budget for the next fiscal year does include additional funding for schools serving low income students and those learning English. Some say that this move is in response to the ACLU law suit, but the Governor insists that he has a long-term concern for the issue. In any case, \$10 million dollars has been added to the Education Budget for these schools, and in addition there is a proposal to add extra-budgetary funding of \$60 million over the next three years to be distributed to each public and charter school as follows: \$500 per year for each student learning English and \$300 for each student from a low-income family. School districts would be able to decide for themselves how the monies would be spent. In some schools, funds would clearly be enough to add additional staff.

The Legislature's Joint Finance Committee is now considering the Governor's budget proposal. It will likely come before the House and Senate for a vote in June.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has a social statement entitled "Our Calling in Education". (You can find it at elca.org/social-statements.) It quotes Martin Luther, in calling for state funding of education: "A city's best and greatest welfare, safety and strengths consist in it having many able, learned, wise, honorable, and well-educated citizens." It goes on, recognizing that "schools with students in poverty consistently represent schools with the fewest resources," to insist that "because all are created in God's image, all have equal worth and dignity and should be treated accordingly...(with) equitable access to high quality schools."

As the Delaware Legislature debates these educational issues this spring, your Senator and Representative would like to hear from you!
